My primary goal is that your children LOVE SPANISH, and become lifelong Spanish students. Therefore, our Spanish classes will be based on a Futura Language Professionals' method of teaching, the *Building Block Method of Learning*®. This method promotes an exposure to the language and its cultures through conversation, songs, games and cultural activities in addition to traditional school work. Please also remember that fluency takes many years of study and living abroad to develop, so be patient. Your child is learning Spanish "*poquito a poco*"-bit by bit! In order to reinforce what your child learns in class, I ask that you review vocabulary with your child daily for a minimum of five minutes. His or her notebook and/or Spanish binder needs to be initialed each week by you, indicating that the review was completed. This review will count each week as a homework assignment.

In addition to daily review, your child will be graded on participation and simple tests. To create the 100% grade, each of these topics will count as:

Participation: 60%

Complete folder: 20%

Oral Tests: 20%

Please note that you are also welcome to contact me at sfalgetelli@immac-church.org or contact the office to discuss your child's Spanish progress.

Some other expectations that I have for Spanish this year are: kids will use some words at home, feel confident, and enjoy the learning of a new language.
