Clay Garden Tiles

This class will teach students how to create animation flip books that give the visual illusion that an object, person, or animal is "moving" from one point to another. We will cover basic drawing skills, storyboarding, and character design. Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Encore at the Library: Gyotaku Fish Prints *

Wednesday, Jul 13, 2-3:30 pm Gyotaku fish prints are a Japanese art form first used to document the size of a prize catch. The prints displayed the size, intricate textures, and details found in nature. Learn about this beautiful art form by printing rubber-cast fish forms on a variety of paper for our own wall art. Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Polymer Clay Steampunk Bugs *

Saturday, Jul 16, 1-3 pm
What's better than creating your own
steampunk style bug out of clay? Use clay and
metal pieces to create a bug that blends nature
with retrofuturistic style. You will receive
instructions on how to safely bake your creation
at home. Registration required. For families. This
program is funded by the Minnesota Arts and
Cultural Heritage Fund.

Science in the Summer

Tuesday, Jul 19, 1-3 pm

With Bakken Museum educators as their guide, burgeoning biologists will practice observational techniques and scientific thinking all while being introduced to real science career paths and having lots of fun. No registration required. For youth entering grades 2-5.

Encore at the Library: Ink Painting with Bamboo Brushes *

Wednesday, Jul 20, 2-3:30 pm
Let's learn how to paint natural scenes with bamboo brushes and ink. We will begin by talking about what makes bamboo paint brushes special, then we will learn about different ways to hold and move our brush to create beautiful lines and shapes. Finally we will learn how to put these marks together into a composition. Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Encore at the Library: Acrylic Painting *

Wednesday, July 27, 2-3:30 pm
In this introductory course we will pour out some colors and learn how to mix and control gradations by painting a rainbow, create effects through blends, dry-brush and washes, and play around with the ideas of incorporating texture into our work. We will work from our imaginations and with artist led demonstrations.

Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Encore at the Library: Weaving a Wild Wall Hanging *

Wednesday, Aug 3, 2-3:30 pm
Learn to make a fabulously soft and fringy wall hanging! We will go over the basic vocabulary, equipment, and techniques to weave a simple wall hanging. We will use yarn, roving, ribbon, scrap fabric, and other assorted materials to create a lush, textural, 'wild' work of art. No previous weaving experience necessary.

Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Encore at the Library: Tangling and Meditative Drawing *

Wednesday, Aug 10, 2-3:30 pm
The concept of a tangling is to practice focus and meditation through drawing patterns using repetitive lines, marks, circles, and shapes.
Students will participate in various skill lessons and activities to help them start developing a meditative drawing practice. Registration required. Ages 6-12.

Young Punks: Art of the Patch

Thursday, Jun 16, 3-5 pm

The patch jacket is a fashion statement, a work of art, and a declaration of identity. In this class we will get started on cultivating our own patch collection by creating several patches using ink, paint, and embroidery techniques. Learn basic design, composition, drawing, and sewing skills. Registration required. Ages 13+ This program is funded by the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

Needle Felted Toadstools *

Thursday, Jun 30, 3-4:30 pm
Add some color and whimsy to your home!
Learn how to use a felting needle to form loose wool roving into an adorable mushroom. When it's complete, add a wood base and a little moss to make the scene come to life. Registration required. Ages 10+

Going Big with Coil Building

Wednesday, Jul 13, 1-3 pm

Come learn the art of coil building as we use this ancient technique to construct a large vase for ourselves. Finished projects will be clear glazed by Artistry before they are returned to students so they will be waterproof and perfect to hold a bouquet. Registration required. Ages 13+ This program is funded by the Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund.

Custom Screen Printing*

Thursdays, Jul 14, 21, 28, Aug 4, 3-4:30 pm Youth will be introduced to making basic handdrawn stencils that can be transferred to a printing screen, and then printed on paper or cloth. Youth will explore the t-shirt as wearable art with the power to convey messages through slogans and unique imagery. Registration required. Ages 13+
